Implemented a new work flow at Harvard University, thanks to a partnership with the IDS Project's creation of an ILLiad add-on. This add-on connects ILLiad to our ILS (Aleph) and creates a brief record with a hold in Aleph for the patron automatically upon receipt of the item. The greatest benefit is allowing patrons to select one of many pickup locations in This new work flow has created a number of efficiencies that allowed us to consolidate workflows, eliminating most ILLiad sites from our original 15, which nearly completes our goal to centralize resource sharing services in our very decentralized university.
